<p>National Curriculum Objectives:</p> <p>Pupils should be taught:</p> <p>to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas</p> <p>to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]</p> <p>about great artists, architects and designers in history</p>	<p>As part of the Geography topic – North America looking at North American Animals choose a favourite animal</p> <p>Research Stylisation in art - the decorative generalisation of figures and objects by means of various conventional techniques, including the simplification of line, form, and relationships of space and colour.</p> <p>With their chosen animal, use the idea of stylisation to simplify their animal using line, shape and form. Stylisation is frequently seen in street art and graffiti-style art, as in the case of the late 20th century artist Keith Haring.</p>  <p>(left to right) an example of ancient Peruvian pottery; Henri Matisse, “Chat aux Poissons Rouges”; Pablo Picasso, “Pitcher and Bowl of Fruit”; Gustav Klimt, “Tree of Life III”; Keith Haring, “Statue of Liberty”</p> <p>Sketch stylised animals in sketch books practising the simple lines and form.</p>		<p>South America Stylisation Techniques Line Form Space Colour Simplify Printing Lino board Multi layered Sketch Background Foreground Impression</p>
<p>Key Learning in Art and Design – Printing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Create printing blocks by simplifying an initial journal idea. ▪ Use relief or impressed method. ▪ Create prints with three overlays. <p>Work into prints with a range of media e.g. pens, colour pens and paints.</p>	<p>Experiment using printing using printing blocks (cardboard) to simplify an initial idea – a North American animal i.e. Raccoon, wolf, cougar or a reindeer.</p> <p>Choose final sketch for final piece.</p> <p>Research how to create a layered lino print using lino board and inks. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=a-L4gTmX8JQ</p> <p>Create their own 3 layered lino printing using a background, main feature (animal) and foreground using 3 different coloured inks.</p> <p>Work into prints afterwards using black fine liner pen to create texture and to accentuate line.</p> <p>Display stylised work on a display in the classroom.</p> <p>Evaluate each others work with peer assessment. What did they enjoy and what would they change if they did this activity again?</p>

<p>National Curriculum Objectives:</p> <p>Pupils should be taught:</p> <p>to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas</p> <p>to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]</p> <p>about great artists, architects and designers in history</p>	<p>Know who American Animal Artist Cassius Marcellus Coolidge is - Cassius Marcellus Coolidge was an American artist, mainly known for his series of paintings Dogs Playing Poker. Known as "Cash" or "Kash" in his family.</p> <p>He often signed his work in the 19th century with the latter spelling, sometimes spelling his name, for comic effect, as Kash Koolidge. Coolidge began his art career in his twenties, one of his early jobs being the creation of cartoons for a local newspaper.</p> <p>Look at his different artwork. Discuss the paintings and what they like and dislike. Explain that this type of artwork was done for comic effect. Watch the clip on bbc bitesize https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zc7dv4j - explaining how to use a free online photo manipulation software https://www2.lunapic.com/editor/ to edit photographs to create new image layering the two images together. (video available)</p> <p>Use the lasso tool on the software to select the specific area of the photo to be removed, this is then pasted onto the second photo to create a new image.</p> <p>Using the clip as inspiration, create images that combine either a famous character body with a friend's head, with permission, combine a teacher head with a cartoon characters body or taking inspiration from Cassius – use an image of their own pet or favourite animal onto a human body.</p> <p>Create a group piece of Artwork in the style of the 'Dog's playing poker' painting with multiple images together.</p>		<p>Artist</p> <p>Paintings</p> <p>Comic</p> <p>Cartoon</p> <p>Scenarios</p> <p>Photo manipulation</p> <p>Photographs</p> <p>Lasso</p> <p>Combine</p> <p>Layering</p> <p>Multiple</p> <p>Editing</p>
